AT-A-GLANCE

This brochure gives Arlington residents age 60 and over an overview of the many transportation services available. Each program listed has details outlining eligibility requirements and includes phone numbers and/or a web address for more information and applications.

Together these programs provide a wide range of options designed to meet specific needs. Fees are varied based on the individual program.

Please note: Some of the transit options listed are for individuals with disabilities, and there is no age requirement to use these services.

Please see each program for more information and point of contact.

NOTE: TTY stands for Text Telephone. It is a special device that lets people who are deaf, hard of hearing, or speech-impaired use the phone to communicate. A TTY is required at both ends of the conversation in order to communicate.

ARLINGTON TRANSIT -ART DISCOUNT

DESCRIPTION ▶ Discount on all Arlington Transit-ART buses for eligible persons.

ELIGIBILITY ▶ Age 65 and over or with disabilities.

TRIP PURPOSE ▶ Any.

AREA SERVED ▶ All routes served by ART.

HOW TO USE/RESERVATIONS ▶ The Senior SmarTrip card allows seniors to ride ART for a reduced fare (see page 3 for info on purchasing a Senior SmarTrip card). Seniors may also pay the reduced cash bus fare of \$0.85 by showing the bus operator a valid Medicare Card and photo ID, or showing a valid government-issued photo ID card with date of birth (passport, driver's license, etc.)

COST/DISCOUNT ▶ Discount is 50% of regular fare.

METRO DISCOUNT & SENIOR SMARTRIP CARD

DESCRIPTION ▶ Discounts on all Metrobus and Metrorail services for eligible persons.

ELIGIBILITY ▶ Age 65 and over or with disabilities.

PREREQUISITES ▶ Completed application.

TRIP PURPOSE ▶ Any.

AREA SERVED ▶ All routes served by Metrobus and Metrorail.

HOW TO USE/RESERVATIONS ▶ The Senior SmarTrip card allows seniors to ride Metrobus, Metrorail and other regional bus services for a reduced fare. Seniors can ride regular Metrobus routes for \$0.85 and ride Metrorail for half the peak fare.

Seniors may also pay the reduced cash bus fare of \$0.85 by showing the bus operator a valid Medicare Card and photo ID, or showing a valid government-issued photo ID card with date of birth (passport, driver's license, etc.) A photo ID is needed to purchase the \$8.75 Weekly Metrobus Senior Pass and the \$10.00 Senior Metrorail Farecard. Note: Transfers are only free when using the SmarTrip card or weekly pass. Cash riders must pay each time they board a bus.

VEHICLE TYPE(S) ▶ SmarTrip cards are used on all public transit buses, including Metrobuses, Metrorail and Arlington Transit – ART.

COMPANIONS ▶ Not applicable

COST/DISCOUNT ▶ Senior citizens may ride for half the peak fare on Metrorail, for \$0.85 on regular Metrobus routes, and for a discounted fare on other participating bus service providers.

TO APPLY ▶ The Senior SmarTrip card can be purchased at the Metro Center Sales Office, Metro Pentagon Sales Office and Commuter Stores (see locations listed on inside back cover). Bring proof of age (birth certificate, driver's license or passport). WMATA 202-637-7000; TTY 202-638-3780.

METRO TRAVEL TRAINING

DESCRIPTION ▶ Free individual or group instruction designed to teach older adults and customers with disabilities how to travel safely and independently on Metrobus and Metrorail. Includes instruction on how to pay fares, read route schedule information and review bus and rail accessibility features.

ELIGIBILITY ▶ Training is for senior citizens or people with disabilities

METRO ACCESS

DESCRIPTION ▶ A door-to-door regional paratransit service sponsored by the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA).

ELIGIBILITY ▶ A disability that prevents use of the bus or rail system. No age requirement. All Arlington residents who are certified for MetroAccess may use STAR. With training, some riders may be able to use fixed route transit for some of their trips.

PREREQUISITES ▶ Completion of an application and a certification interview.

TRIP PURPOSE ▶ No restrictions.

AREA SERVED ▶ Anywhere in the Metrobus and Metrorail service area.

HOW TO USE/RESERVATIONS ▶ Make a reservation at least 24 hours before ride is needed by calling 301-562-5360 or (TTY) 301-588-7535.

VEHICLE TYPE(S) ▶ Taxis or vans. Wheelchair accessible vehicles upon request.

COMPANIONS ▶ Companions may ride along (on a space available basis) for the same fare as the MetroAccess eligible person. Personal Care Attendants (PCAs) ride free.

COST/DISCOUNT ▶ Up to \$6.50 per one-way trip.

STAR (SPECIALIZED TRANSIT FOR ARLINGTON RESIDENTS)

DESCRIPTION ▶ STAR is Arlington County's pre-arranged, reserved trip, curb-to-curb service for persons with a disability. STAR operates as part of the Arlington Transit system and is an alternative to MetroAccess. Service is available 5:30 AM - midnight, seven days a week.

ELIGIBILITY A person with a disability that prevents the use of the bus or rail system. No age requirement.

PREREQUISITES ▶ Must be certified eligible for the MetroAccess program (see MetroAccess section on page 5) and live in Arlington County.

TRIP PURPOSE ▶ No restrictions.

AREA SERVED ▶ Anywhere in the Metrobus or Metrorail service area.

HOW TO USE/RESERVATIONS ▶ Call STAR Monday – Friday, 8:30am-6:30pm and Saturdays 9am-5pm. If the STAR Call Center will be closed on a Monday holiday, it will be open the preceding Sunday from 11am-3pm. Residents certified to use MetroAccess may request a trip from one to seven days in advance, or set up standing trips for the same time(s) and same day(s) each week. Call 703-892-TRIP (8747); TTY: Virginia Relay Center 800-828-1120.

VEHICLE TYPE(S) ➤ Taxis, sedans, accessible SUVs or minivans. Wheelchair accessible vehicles upon request.

STAR (SPECIALIZED TRANSIT FOR ARLINGTON RESIDENTS)

COMPANIONS ► Companions may ride along (on a space available basis) for the STAR reduced fare. PCAs ride free.

COST/DISCOUNT ▶ Zone 1: \$3.50 for trips inside Arlington. Zone 2: \$5.00 for trips to DC, Alexandria, Falls Church, or Fairfax County inside the Beltway and to Inova Fairfax Hospital/ Woodburn Mental Health at 3300 Gallows Road and the Insight Memory Care Center at 2812 Old Lee Highway. Zone 3: \$9.00 for trips to Fairfax County outside the Beltway, Montgomery County or Prince George's County. All trips must begin or end in Arlington. MetroAccess is also available for these rides for a \$6.50 maximum fare.

STAR COUPONS ▶ Coupons that can be used to pay the fare for STAR services. Coupons must be purchased ahead of time at a Commuter Store (see locations on inside back cover) or online at www.CommuterDirect.com. Coupons come in booklets of 10 and cost \$35 for a booklet of the \$3.50 coupons, \$40 for a booklet of the \$4.00 coupons, \$50.00 for a booklet of the \$5.00 coupons.

STAR ASSISTED TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

DESCRIPTION ▶ Driver/escort between door of home and office of health care provider. Service is an add-on for STAR users who qualify. Service is available 5:30am – midnight, seven days a week.

ELIGIBILITY Arlington residents age 60 and over in need of a personal care attendant and unable to use curb-to-curb service.

PREREQUISITES ▶ Certified eligible by MetroAccess and participating in STAR program; complete an application and a home visit assesment.

TRIP PURPOSE ▶ Health care appointments, visits to family member in nursing home or assisted living residence.

AREA SERVED ▶ Anywhere in the Metrobus or Metrorail service area.

HOW TO USE/RESERVATIONS ▶

Call STAR at 703-892-TRIP (8747); TTY: Virginia Relay Center 800-828-1120, Monday – Friday, 8:30am - 6:30pm and Saturdays 9am - 5pm.

VEHICLE TYPE(S) ▶ Taxis, sedans, accessible SUVs or minivans. Wheelchair accessible vehicles upon request.

COMPANIONS ▶ Companions may ride along (on a space available basis) for the same STAR reduced fare.

COST ▶ Maximum of \$10 per one-way trip, based on income, plus the one-way trip STAR zone fee of \$3.50, \$5.00 or \$9.00.

STAR TEMPORARY ELIGIBILITY AND INTERIM STAR

DESCRIPTION ▶ **Temporary STAR** service is available to Arlington residents who have a temporary condition that prevents driving or using public transportation (e.g., a broken leg). The user must have a physician's note stating the condition and estimated duration of the condition. The service can be used for up to three months. **Interim STAR** is for Arlington residents age 60 and over who have submitted an application for MetroAccess and meet all criteria but have not yet been approved.

TRIP PURPOSE ▶ Trips are limited to healthcare appointments.

AREA SERVED ▶ Trips are restricted to inside the beltway in Virginia, Washington, D.C., and the Fairfax Hospital Complex.

HOW TO USE/RESERVATIONS ▶ Call STAR at 703-892-TRIP (8747); TTY: Virginia Relay Center 800-828-1120, Monday – Friday, 8:30am - 6:30pm and Saturdays 9am - 5pm. Service is available 5:30am - midnight, seven days a week.

VEHICLE TYPE(S) ➤ Taxis, sedans, accessible SUVs or minivans. Wheelchair accessible vehicles upon request.

COMPANIONS Companions may ride along (on a space available basis) for the same fare as the temporarily STAR eligible person.

COST/DISCOUNT ▶ See "Cost/Discount" under STAR on page 7 for pricing information.

WALTER REED ADULT DAY HEALTH CARE CENTER

DESCRIPTION ▶ Door-to-door transportation service available to participants in Arlington's Adult Day Health Care Center located at 2909 16th Street South, Arlington, VA 22204.

ELIGIBILITY ▶ Participants in Arlington's Adult Day Health Care Center Program.

TRIP PURPOSE ▶ Transportation between home and Arlington's Adult Day Health Care Center.

AREA SERVED ▶ Arlington.

HOW TO USE/RESERVATIONS ▶ Arranged by center staff.

VEHICLE TYPE(S) ▶ Wheelchair accessible vehicles available.

COMPANIONS ▶ Not applicable.

COST/DISCOUNT ▶ Sliding fee scale.

MEDICAID TRANSPORTATION (LOGISTICARE)

DESCRIPTION ▶ Non-emergency transportation to the nearest enrolled Medicaid provider for a service covered by Medicaid.

ELIGIBILITY Medicaid recipients who are not participating in health maintenance organization (HMO) and have no other transportation available.

PREREQUISITES ▶ Medicaid-approved treatment.

TRIP PURPOSE ▶ Medical appointment paid for by Medicaid.

AREA SERVED ▶ Northern Virginia.

HOW TO USE/RESERVATIONS ▶

Call 1-866-386-8331 (LogistiCare) at least 48 hours in advance. Must have your Medicaid number available when calling. Standing orders can be arranged. Social Service agencies may call 1-866-679-6330.

VEHICLE TYPE(S) ▶ As appropriate, determined by LogistiCare.

COMPANIONS ▶ If medically necessary.

COST/DISCOUNT ▶ Not applicable.

SENIOR CENTER ADULT TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM (SCAT)

DESCRIPTION ▶ A pre-arranged shared-ride cab transportation service for Arlington residents to travel between their homes and Arlington Senior Centers (see below for list of centers).

ELIGIBILITY ▶ Age 55 and over. Must be registered with the Office of Senior Adult Programs (annual fee of \$20 for Arlington County residents).

PREREQUISITES ▶ Submit application to STAR.

TRIP PURPOSE ▶ Transportation to and from programs at Senior and Community Centers.

AREA SERVED ▶ Arlington.

HOW TO USE/RESERVATIONS ▶ Call 703-892-8747 between 8:30am – 4:30pm at least one day in advance. May call up to one week in advance. May set up a standing order.

VEHICLE TYPE(S) ▶ Taxis or vans. Wheelchair accessible vehicles upon request.

COMPANIONS ▶ Not applicable.

COST/DISCOUNT ▶ \$2.50 each way for cab ride (\$5.00 roundtrip). An additional discount can be obtained by purchasing a coupon book from Red Top (703-522-3333) and Yellow Cab Company (703-522-2222).

SENIOR LOOPS GROCERY SHOPPING

DESCRIPTION ➤ Weekly/monthly grocery shopping for residents of The Carlin, Claridge House, Culpepper Garden, Hunter's Park, Woodland Hill and select neighborhoods.

ELIGIBILITY Arlington residents age 55 and over who are residents of the locations listed above or who can get to those locations.

PREREQUISITES ▶ Must fill out a registration form.

AREA SERVED ▶ Arlington.

HOW TO USE/RESERVATIONS ▶ Call STAR at 703-892-8747 at least 24 hours in advance.

VEHICLE TYPE(S) ▶ Diamond Transportation provides the service using a wheelchair accessible van.

COMPANIONS ▶ Not applicable.

COST/DISCOUNT ▶ No charge.

TO APPLY ▶ Registration forms are available from the management of each senior resident and from STAR. Neighborhood residents should call STAR at 703-892-8747 to request a form. Return the completed form to residence management or STAR.

DOOR-THRU-DOOR

DESCRIPTION ▶ For adults who need help in getting to and from health care appointments. Home care aides help individuals prepare for the trip, get to and from the vehicle, accompany persons during the health care appointment, provide assistance in returning home, and when appropriate share information with family caregivers and community service providers.

PREREQUISITES ▶ Must be a resident of either Arlington County or the City of Alexandria. Must be 18 or older and unable to travel to non-urgent medical appointments alone.

TRIP PURPOSE ▶ Getting to and from non-urgent health care appointments within 10 miles of Arlington or Alexandria.

AREA SERVED ▶ Arlington and Alexandria.

HOW TO USE/RESERVATIONS ▶ Contact Home Care Partners at 202-638-0736 or 202-638-2382. Email: tthomas@homecarepartners.com

COMPANIONS ▶ Aide escorts can be requested for weekday medical appointments with short times between 8am - 3pm. Clients must be able to get out of their homes with minimal assistance. Aide are not able to lift or carry clients.

COST/DISCOUNT ▶ Transportaion costs.

SUPER SENIOR TAXI

DESCRIPTION ▶ Arlington County's subsidized taxi program.

ELIGIBILITY ▶ Arlington residents age 70 and over.

PREREQUISITES Submit application by mail to the Arlington Agency on Aging or in person at one of the Commuter Stores (see inside back cover).

TRIP PURPOSE ▶ Any.

AREA SERVED ▶ Anywhere within the cab company's service area. Trip must start or end in Arlington.

HOW TO USE/RESERVATIONS ▶ After you receive "welcome" information and an order form from the Agency on Aging, purchase fare coupons by mail, phone, or at a Commuter Store (see locations on inside back cover) for the cab company (Red Top or Yellow) you wish to use. Coupons work like cash for fares. Make reservations as you would for any taxi ride.

VEHICLE TYPE(S) ▶ Taxis or vans. Wheelchair accessible vehicles upon request.

COMPANIONS ▶ Same as any taxi.

COST/DISCOUNT ▶ \$20 book of taxi coupons purchased for \$10. May purchase up to 20 books per year.

TAXICAB DISCOUNTS

DESCRIPTION ▶ Three taxicab companies that serve Arlington offer a 10% discount to older passengers and persons with disabilities.

ELIGIBILITY ▶ Older or disabled passengers. Call cab company for information.

PREREQUISITES ▶ None.

TRIP PURPOSE ▶ Any.

AREA SERVED ▶ Anywhere within the cab company's service area.

HOW TO USE/RESERVATIONS ▶ Blue Top Cab Company offers a discount to older passengers who request the discount from the driver at the time of the trip. Red Top and Yellow Cab Companies sell coupon books at a 10% discount that are used as fare and turned in at the time of the ride. (see page 17). For information or to purchase call 703-525-0900. Make reservations as you would for any taxi ride.

VEHICLE TYPE(S) ▶ Taxi. Wheelchair accessible vehicles available upon advance request.

COMPANIONS ▶ Not applicable.

COST/DISCOUNT ▶ 10% discount.

ARLINGTON NEIGHBORHOOD VILLAGES (ANV)

DESCRIPTION ▶ Enables members to continue living in their own homes and communities as they age by providing access to support services, including transportation.

ELIGIBILITY ▶ Must be 55 or older and live in Arlington County.

PREREQUISITES ▶ Must be a member.

TRIP PURPOSE ▶ Trips to the grocery store, medical appointments, or ANV sponsored activities.

AREA SERVED ▶ Arlington County.

HOW TO USE/RESERVATIONS ▶ Once you are a member information on how to arrange services will be provided and set-up through ANV.

VEHICLE TYPE(S) ▶ Varies upon needs.

COMPANIONS ► Companions are allowed. A companion can also be arranged to attend medical visits.

COST/DISCOUNT ▶ There are three levels of membership: Full Individual Membership is \$500 a year; Full Household Membership is \$500 per year for the first member plus \$250 for each additional member; Associate Membership is \$500 per year for an individual or household membership but excludes any volunteer provided services.
